Economic Development Department, Office of Science and Technology Launch New Websites

SANTA FE, NM – The New Mexico Economic Development Department (NMEDD), and the Department’s Office of Science and Technology (OST) today unveiled new websites. The new NMEDD site represents a complete redesign of the agency’s existing website, while the OST site is a first for the division.

The NMEDD website address remains the same (www.goNM.biz). The OST website can be found at www.nmsciencetech.com.

“The Department’s website needed a new coat of paint, so we thought this would be the opportune time not only to give a new look and feel to the NMEDD site, but also to launch a separate site for our growing Science and Technology division,” said Cabinet Secretary Designate Fred Mondragón. “Both sites are comprehensive, user-friendly and are constantly updated to ensure visitors are getting their questions answered, along with the latest news from the Department.”

The redesigned NMEDD website is easier to navigate and includes more detailed information for users on the Department’s various business and community programs, eligibility and how to apply. Other features include dedicated Spaceport America and New Mexico Film Office pages, press release archives, staff directory, calendar of events, data center, a selected listing of New Mexico products and links to other economic development organizations.

Stephan Helgesen, Director of the Office of Science and Technology, said it was important for the division to create its own, dedicated site for several reasons. “Science and Technology is playing an increasingly important role in New Mexico's future as we move to capitalize on the State's strengths,” Helgesen said. “We believe that by showcasing this impressive scientific diversity we will bring new business interests to the State as well as find new partners within our borders.”
